Figure 1: Frequent Church Attendance among Urban Parents

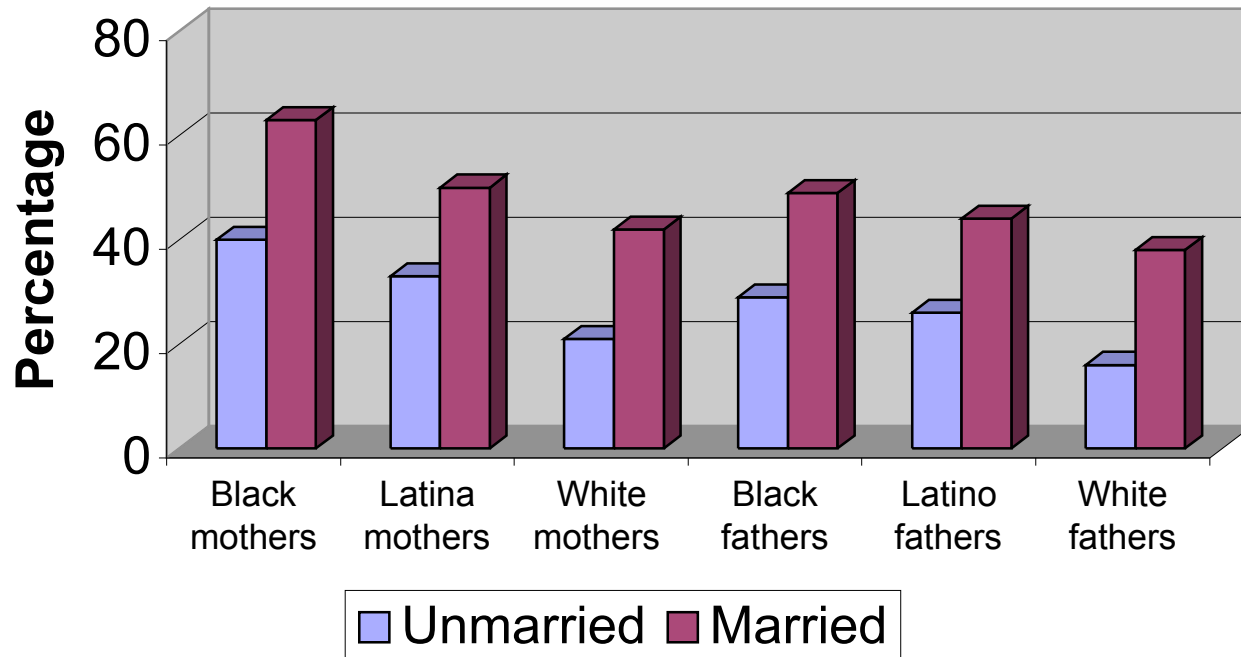
