- 3. Does the law view the unethical use of cell phones and camera phones as a serious offense?
- 4. What are the consequences for someone found guilty of using a cell phone in an inappropriate manner?
- 5. Are their pre-determined fines, penalties, or punishment for this crime? If not, how is an appropriate punishment determined?
- 6. Is it difficult to find someone guilty of this crime? Why or why not?
- 7. How do the victims of inappropriate cell phone or camera phone use generally feel?
- 8. What can be done to prevent people from using their cell phones or camera phones in a way that invades people's privacy?
- 9. Is talking on the phone while driving viewed as an unethical or dangerous use of cell phones? Why or why not? What are the consequences?
- 10. Do you think that schools should enforce strict rules regarding the use of cell phones in school? In your opinion, what should those rules be?
